

AWARDS

All participants will receive awards, **based half on in-ring judging and half on judging by a panel of "secret" judges**, who will observe participants throughout the day and rank them based on the following formula:

- 20 points - How they treat/relate to their cat
 - 20 points - Sportsmanship
 - 30 points - Courtesy/helpfulness to other exhibitors/spectators
 - 10 points - Neatness of benching area
 - 20 points - General attitude
- 100 points - TOTAL For Secret Judges**

In-ring judging is based on:

- 25 points - Exhibitor's presentation of cat, including: (5 points each) picking up cat, showing head, showing body, showing tail, exhibiting control of cat
 - 20 points - Examination by exhibitor - The exhibitor checks: (2 points each): both eyes, both ears, nose, mouth, teeth, gums, nails, skin, coat, general body condition
 - 20 points - Grooming Examination by Judge: (2 Points each): eyes, ears, nose, mouth, teeth, gums, nails, skin, coat, general body condition
 - 20 points - Interview of Exhibitor about general knowledge of cats including: (5 Points each): cat health (prevention of disease, cleanliness, vaccinations, safety, basic anatomy, etc.), emotional welfare of cat (socialization, play, comfort, relationship to humans, discipline, etc.), grooming, nutrition
 - 15 points - Exhibitor's: (5 points each): appearance, attitude, sportsmanship
- 100 points - TOTAL For In-Ring Judging**

Guidelines to participating in the junior showmanship contest

SCHEDULE

7:30-8:30 am Check-in and set-up. Parents are allowed to help you set up. **Cats MUST be in carriers. See enclosed list of suggested items to bring along.**

8:30 am Exhibitor meeting at the judging ring. All showmanship exhibitors should attend this meeting to go over the rules. **Parents are encouraged to attend.**

9:00 am Cat show officially begins. PARENTS ARE NO LONGER ALLOWED IN THE BENCHING AREA. Exhibitors must be able to groom and present their cats on their own. Parents may stay in the show hall, but can not enter the benching area.

1:00 pm Showmanship Judging Anyone in the show hall may watch.

4:00 pm Awards Presentation

4:30 pm Official release of entries

NOTE: Because part of the judging is how the participant relates to the cat, grooms, keeps benching area neat, etc., parents will NOT be allowed in the benching area once setup is complete. **Parents are welcome in the show hall and participants are allowed to go ask questions, etc.** There will be an adult assigned to the showmanship program to supervise activities and help with any emergencies.

If parents intend to leave the show hall, they should provide the participant with lunch money. Participants are expected to remain in the show hall and adjacent lobby area throughout the day.

If a parent is also an exhibitor, they should bring enough supplies that the showmanship contestant can set up his/her own benching area.
